



### Topic 1 – Digital Interclub Competition Info

- Pictorial: A 26 clubs, B clubs 13 clubs
- Nature: A 20 clubs, B 18 clubs
- Clubs: 41
- Photos per competition: 300
- Competitions per year: 3 Fall, Winter, Spring
- Classes: A Advanced, B Basic (beginning and intermediate competitors)





- can do a better job getting info out
- NECCC improve tools to help communication, add links to gallery

### Topic 3 – Award Ribbons

Today: NECCC USPS mails award ribbons to clubs.

Should physical ribbons be replaced with something else?

### Topic 4 – Categories

Today - Nature and Pictorial (Open)

Categories – add, remove or change?

Considerations when adding a category

- Adds 150 more photos
- Probably needs more judges

Notes – view recording for details

- Add creative, don't add creative
- Drop nature, keep nature
- Add monochrome, don't add mono
- Small clubs struggle to find photos, can't find 4 more photos
- Clubs don't need to participate in all categories
- Consider subcategories in pictorial
- Might need more judges and 2 days to show results if more categories

### Topic 5 – Category Rules

Today: Nature – uses PSA rules, Pictorial (Open) – uses interclub rules

Rules – add, remove or change?

Notes – view recording for details

- Use PSA
- Don't use PSA
- Don't change
- Change
- Members, Reps and Judges need to know the rules

Considerations when changing rules

- Some don't know current rules
- Announce changes multiple times
- Provide info (training?) for members, reps and judges
- PSA rules provide a well documented standard
- PSA rules help with clubs entering PSA contests

### Topic 6 – Club Hosting Role

Today: Find judges. Download photos and spreadsheets. Score photos. Enter scores into spreadsheets. Email spreadsheets back.

Suggestions?

- Notes view recording for details
- Generally, works
- Some clubs use as program night
- Should be online
- Does not need to be online
- All clubs should be able to attend
- Can it be recorded

### Topic 7 – Judges Allowed Previews

Today: Often judges have early access to photos so they have time evaluate the whole photo.

Should clubs always provide judges a preview of photos days before scoring?

Notes – view recording for details

- If possible
- Yes
- Unclear if clubs have the ability to let judges see photos early
- If everyone used the same competition software, might be easier

Judging styles does not preclude providing the judge with early access to review the photos.

- 1. Offline remote judges that enter scores individually before the competition. Judges are not *required* at the competition.
- 2. Online remote judges score online at the hosting club meeting.
- 3. In Person judges score while attending the hosting club meeting. Smallest available pool of judges due to need to travel to the hosting club.

### Topic 8 – Judge Meetings

Today: There are other ideas we have discussed on these calls to help avoid inconsistencies between judges.

Should judges have a pre-scoring meeting to discuss **non-qualified** photos? Should the judges have a pre-scoring meeting to discuss the **[top] photos**? Should we have judge qualification guidelines?

- Discussing non-qualified photos is good
- Discussing all photo is good and bad
- We should have judge qualification
- We should allow judges to only judge the categories they want to

### Topic 9 – Scoring

Today: Photos receive scores from 5 to 9. 5 - for photographs that are below average for the class being judged 6 - to photographs that are average for the class 7 or 8 - to photographs above the class average 9 - to the two or three photographs that are the best in each class


Should half-points be allowed to help differentiate photos?


Should a disqualified photo score be zero points?

3 - not used4 - for disqualified photographs

Notes – view recording for details

- All comments supported half point scores
- Half points may not help reduce ties in award places
- Disqualified should be zero
- Disqualified should not be zero, hurts chance of finishing on top





### Topic 10 – Photo Title Visibility

While not technically an element, titles are a very important component to your competition image. *Photo Competition Prep: A Fresh Look at the 12 Elements, March 24, 2017 - Professional Photographers of America (PPA).* 

Should titles be visible to judges when scoring?

While not technically an element, titles are a very important component to your competition image. It's your only chance to actually talk to the judges, so think carefully about what you choose to say. Do you really want to throw away that chance to talk by saying something that a hundred other people have already said? Old and tired titles do little to advance your cause. And some titles have absolutely nothing to do with telling the story of the image and can end up being a stumbling block for judges who are trying to reconcile the two. Use your titles to draw out the story. Point your viewers in the direction you want them to look. After you've worked so hard to capture the image, process it perfectly, and then print or prepare it for display, don't let a mundane, tired, boring, overused, ill-fitting title be the first thing the judges encounter.

### Topic 11 – Photo Resolution

Today: Resolution is max-width 1400 pixels and max-height 1050 pixels. Roughly, 1.5 MP resolution. All aspect ratios (panorama, portrait, landscape, square ...) are supported by every resolution.

### Topic 12 – Avoiding Disqualification from Re-using a Previously Submitted Photo

Once a photograph has been entered into an NECCC Projected Image Interclub Competition (either pictorial or nature), it may never be entered again. *For many clubs, this is a decade or more of entries*.

Duplication happens often. At least twice in current Winter 2023 competition.

Suggestions?

- Often handled by clubs tracking their previously submitted photos.
- Involve multiple people at a club to double check.
- What about adding an age limit to reduce the tracking effort? For example, the photos must be taken in the last two or three years. A key goal of most camera clubs is having members taking photos.
- Very hard to automate checking with technology.

Notes - view recording for details

- Big issue with managing archives
- Especially if the Rep/person submitting photos changes
- An NECCC multiple year gallery could help
- Age limit is one more burden on Reps
- No way to enforce age limit on photos
- Upload can enforce age limit using metadata
- Not every photo has metadata
- Failed at our club
- Works at our club

# Topic 13 – Avoiding Disqualification from a Photographer Submitting from Two Clubs

Happens every competition. Again, at least twice in current Winter 2023 competition.

Suggestions?

Notes – view recording for details - Always is about communicating and verifying with photographer

- Communicate the rule to your club members.
- Verify with photographer before submitting photos from them.

### Topic 14 – Uploading

Next Season: By popular demand we are moving to a new upload technology

#### New upload technology

- 1. No file naming requirements
- 2. For security, the upload requires sign in
- 3. Title and Photographer info supplied as part of upload form
- 4. Upload allows club to change photo and info, until close date
- 5. File size limit 40MBs, JPEG's, non-sRGB color space warnings
- 6. What else?

### Topic 16 – Balancing Clubs Across Classes

Today - Clubs winning class B in each category for a season will be moved up to class A for the next season. The bottom club in class A may be moved down to class B if necessary, to maintain a balance between the two classes.
